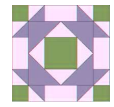

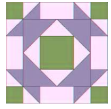

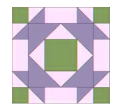
You know our quilt show creeps up on us before you know it so start planning now what quilt you want to make and get going!! Keep Quilting!!!

Minutes of the August 2, 2022, Shiner Heritage Quilter's Meeting

On August 2, 2022, President Janet Ferguson called the meeting to order and welcomed the members of the Shiner Heritage Quilters and visitors. There were 24 members and 8 visitors in attendance. Among those visitors present were Kate with the Austin Quilt Guild who presented the guild's show quilt. The Austin quilt show will take place in September.

The Guild members recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Janet thanked the hostesses for the evening, Myra Zumwalt, Betty Kloesel and Rae Nell Janik.

Janet reported the Montgomery County Quilt Guild would present the Montgomery Quilt Walk on September 30th through October 1st in Montgomery Texas.

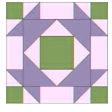
Janet presented the Meeting Minutes for the July 12th meeting and asked if there were any corrections. Bernadette Kresta pointed out during the last three months there were 30 quilts donated to Norma's House and nursing homes, not 14 as the Minutes reflected. Nola Bohuslav motioned the July 12th Minutes be approved after the above correction is made. Rae Nell Janik seconded the Motion and Motion was approved unanimously.

Toni Rogers then asked for Sunshine and Shadows, and August birthdays were celebrated.

Kathleen introduced Kritsi Asbill Brightwell, whom you may remember assisted her mother, Jackie Asbill, when Jackie conducted a quilt-as-you-go workshop earlier this year. This evening Kritsi is going to present a trunk show of her favorite quilts. Please welcome Kristi to our meeting.

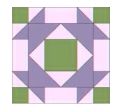
Old Business:

Janet turned the meeting over to Mary Shafer for the final report on the Youth Quilting classes. Mary reported there were six students in the class, and each were able to complete a quilt top. She also thanked the members who were present to assist the students but said most of the members were tasked with not only helping the students but with other tasks which took them away from assisting the students. She reiterated the importance of members attending the classes even if for only one day of the four

sessions. Even with the shortage of helpers, everyone had an enjoyable time, and the students learned a lot.

Janet once again reminded the members beginning in September the meetings would begin with the social hour at 5:00pm and the meeting would begin at 5:30pm

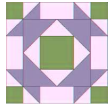
Janet said she is continuing to get pictures of the few members not in the current photo membership roster. She brought with her the additional copies for those who have not picked up theirs. Janet also said there were a few corrections which needed to be made to prior copies which were distributed at the last meeting. She has prepared labels to correct those errors and distributed them to members who needed them.

Janet noted Debbie Novosad has tested positive for COVID, and she will report on the progress of the committee who is tasked with selecting pattern and fabrics for the 2024 Donation Quilt at the next meeting.

Regarding the bus trip to Austin to attend their quilt show, which is to take place September 23rd through the 25th. Janet said she has received quotes from Western Motorcoach for \$1,850 and another quote from Daisy Coaches for \$2,646. After discussion, it was decided to contact Western Motorcoach to confirm the cost and date of the trip. Dates available for Western Motorcoach are Friday the 22nd or Saturday the 23rd. Janet pointed out the bus will seat 56 passengers and we should have at least 20 members to sign up for the trip. She distributed a sign-up sheet to fill in if they want to make the trip and whether the trip should be made on Friday or Saturday. She also suggested we offer seats to other quilt guilds in the area to see if any of their members would like to join us. Members of our guild would not be charged for the cost of the trip, but non-members would pay \$25.00 each. Everyone would pay their own entry fee of \$15.00.

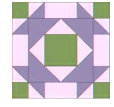
Janet distributed the proposed budget to the members for review prior to the September meeting, when the final budget will be presented to the members for approval without discussion. Some changes needed to be made to the proposed budget, such as adding in the cost if the mid-year dinner and bingo.

Regarding the Yoakum Museum Christmas Tree exhibit which will take place in December, Janet said she had spoken with Laura Henson who advised her the theme for the exhibit

is "Winter White," which leaves it up to the members for interpretation to decorate the Guild's tree. A volunteer is needed to head a committee to begin working on this project.

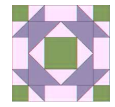
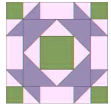

Annette and Dee distributed packets to members who are interested in participating in the challenge.

New Business:

Janet explained pursuant to the Policies and Procedures the president is to appoint a committee to make recommendations and amounts to be distributed to area community organizations to receive proceeds from the biennial donation quilt. She asked if anyone would volunteer to be on the committee, and Irene Cerny, Diana Henk, Wanda Myers, Rae Nell Janik and Janet Ferguson volunteered.

Finally, Janet advised the membership pursuant to an officers' meeting held on July 21st, after discussion, the officers unanimously voted to raise the membership fee to \$20.00, beginning September 2022.

After Show and Tell, Janet Ferguson adjourned the meeting.

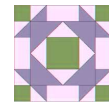
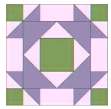
