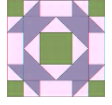

Minutes of the January 4, 2022, Shiner Heritage Quilter's Meeting

On January 4, 2022, in the absence of President Janet Ferguson, Rose Mary Havlik called the meeting to order and welcomed the members of the Shiner Heritage Quilters. There were 23 members and one visitor in attendance.

The Guild members recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Rose Mary thanked the hostesses for the evening, Bennie Gerdes, Janet Zabransky and Rose Mary Havlik.

Rose Mary presented the Meeting Minutes for the November 2nd meeting and asked if there were any corrections. Pinkie Leatherwood said that all corrections that had been reported had been made to the Minutes. Nola Bohuslav made a motion that the November 2, 2021, Minutes be approved as corrected and Dee Heberle seconded the Motion. The Motion was approved unanimously.

Rae Nell Janik read the November and December 2021 Treasurer's Reports. Rae Nell noted that one correction had been made to the Treasurer's Report, and it was filed for audit.

Old Business:

Rose Mary then turned the meeting over to Mary Shafer to update the membership on the status of the preparation for the Quilt Show.

Mary reported that the Quilt Show Committee had met immediately prior to the meeting of the membership. Publications Chairs have been contacting quilt shops to update their mailing list and have worked with the post office to minimize the cost of mass mailing of the bookmarks. They will be setting up newspaper ads and radio announcements for two weeks prior to the show.

Mary also indicated that the committee is in the process of setting up a workday before the March meeting to assist anyone needing a sleeve for their quilt entry. Members will be notified as soon as a location, date and time has been confirmed.

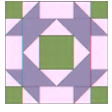
As of the meeting only 22 quilt entries have been received. A show of hands was requested as to any additional quilts would be entered by the members. Many more quilts of all sizes are needed. Entry forms for the quilts must be returned by February 1st. Quilts are to be turned in to the Methodist Church Community Center March 8th, between 10:30 am and 6:30 pm.

Members should also be prepared to bring their items for the Boutique 3:00 pm prior to the February 1st guild meeting.

The guild will have a booth at the Hallettsville Market Days Saturday, February 19th. Members are needed to assist with ticket sales and handing out bookmarks.

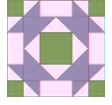
It was asked what members are to wear to the quilt show. Member badges and shirts information will be addressed soon.

Toni Rogers then asked for Sunshine and Shadows and November birthdays were celebrated.

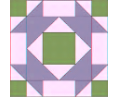
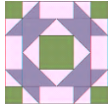
New Business:
