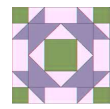

- If you have any ideas or suggestions for other programs, please let Kathleen know.

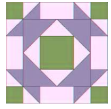
Hostesses for Upcoming Meetings

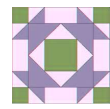

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Minutes of the May 3, 2022, Shiner Heritage Quilter's Meeting

On May 3, 2022, President Janet Ferguson called the meeting to order and welcomed the members of the Shiner Heritage Quilters. There were 28 members in attendance.

The Guild members recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Janet thanked the hostesses for the evening, Irene Cerny, Toni Rogers and Kathleen Schacherl.

Janet presented the Meeting Minutes for the April 4th meeting and asked if there were any corrections. Pinkie Leatherwood noted that two corrections had been made to the Minutes: in the third paragraph under New Business, the phrase was changed to "if there was **anyone** who would volunteer"; and the last sentence of that same paragraph was corrected to read "Dee Heberle volunteered to head that project and she will be reporting on her progress over the next few meetings." Nola Bohuslav made a motion that the May 3rd Minutes be approved with the corrections noted above. Annette Meyer seconded the Motion and Motion was approved unanimously.

Rae Nell Janik read the April Treasurer's Report and it was filed for audit.

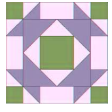
Toni Rogers then asked for Sunshine and Shadows, and April birthdays were celebrated.

Kathleen Schacherl said that Wanda Maas Calico Quilt Shop was present at the meeting with the shop's mobile quilt store, The Queen Bee, located in the parking lot. She reminded everyone that the June meeting would be the Guild's annual BINGO night.

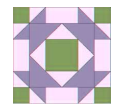
Old Business:

Janet asked Rae Nell for a financial report from the Quilt Show. Ray Nell reported that after expenses, the profit from the Show was \$7,570.66.

Janet reminded everyone that there are Membership Books still available for those who had not received the 2022 version of the books.



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Janet then turned the meeting over to Bernadette Kresta for a report regarding the nursing home and Norma's House quilts. Bernadette said she needed an additional three quilts to bring the total to ten quilts that would be ready for delivery to the various nursing homes and Norma's House.

Janet reminded the members that pursuant to the motion made and approved at the previous meeting, beginning September 6th the Guild's meeting times would be changed as follows: social time would begin at 5:00pm and the meeting would begin at 5:30pm. A reminder will be posted in the monthly newsletter each month through August.

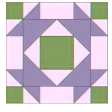
Janet reported that she is continuing to work on the photo membership roster and still needs 12 more photographs. She will be contacting the members whose photographs she needs to have their pictures taken.

Janet said a large unfinished quilt was included in Gwen Easterly's fabric donation to the Guild. There was a discussion regarding completing the quilt and it was decided that anyone who wanted to help with this project would meet at the Church at the June meeting at 5:30pm before social time and work on the quilt until the meeting begins at 6:30pm. There was also a discussion regarding what to do with the remaining fabric. Several suggestions were made, such as using the fabric for nursing homes and Norma's House, making blocks for the bags for participants of the youth quilting classes and perhaps giving any remaining fabric to the Lutheran ladies quilters.

Janet turned the meeting over to Rae Nell to provide the details of the July dinner meeting on July 12th. The meal will be brisket, sausage and sides. Everyone is encouraged to bring a desert to complete the meal.

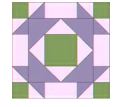
Janet reminded everyone that June is BINGO month. There will be a short meeting prior the game and everyone should remember to bring their BINGO cards and buttons. Treasurer, Rae Nell Janik

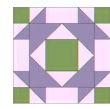
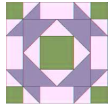
There was a discussion regarding the nominees and Janet asked if there was anyone else who would like to be added to the slate of officers. However, no one stepped forward, so the slate will remain as presented. Janet pointed out that Rae Nell has already served two consecutive terms. The By-Laws state that each officer is limited to two consecutive terms. Before Rae Nell can be approved to continue as treasurer, a motion must be made and approved to allow her to serve a third consecutive term. Nola Bohuslav made a motion that Rae Nell Janik be approved to run for a third term in the position of treasurer. Diana Henk seconded the motion, and the motion was approved unanimously. As a result, there will be no discussion at the June meeting prior to the approval of the slate of officers for the 2022-2024 fiscal years.

New Business:

Janet then turned the meeting over to Irene Cerny and Mary Shafer for a report on the progress of the Youth Quilt Class. The next step is to contact the Church and confirm whether the class can be scheduled for the third week of July. Additionally, a time will be scheduled for cutting fabric and other preparations for the class. These details will be reported at the June meeting.

Janet discussed whether the Guild would be interested in participating in the Independence Day Parade which will take place on July 2nd in Shiner. After discussion, the matter was tabled until the June meeting.

The next order of business is the need for a committee for the 2024 Quilt Show Donation Quilt. This committee will decide on the pattern, colors and fabrics to be used for the Quilt. After discussion, the following members offered their assistance: Debbie Novosad, Mary Schafer, Bernadette Kresta, Rae Nell Janik, Kathleen Schacherl and Janet Ferguson.



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Finally, Janet reminded the members that the Guild usually makes a donation to the Church for the use of their facilities during the current fiscal year. After discussion, Betty Kloesel made a motion that the amount of the donation be \$1,000.00. The Motion was seconded by Bernadette Kresta and passed unanimously.

After Show and Tell and the drawing of door prizes, Janet Ferguson adjourned the meeting.

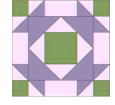
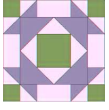
