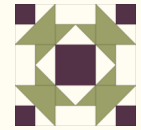

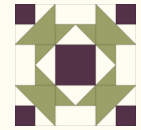

MINUTES - OCTOBER 1, 2024, SHINER HERITAGE QUILTERS MEETING

The meeting of the Shiner Heritage Quilters Guild was called to order by President Linda Parr on October 1, 2024 at 6:00 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. There were 37 members and 2 visitors present.

Linda thanked the hostesses: Irene Cerny, Toni Rogers, Laura Kaspar and Carolyn Hilscher for their refreshments.

Linda introduced Wilma Williams from the Smithville Stitches Quilt Guild who invited the membership to the "Annual Airing of Quilts" on Saturday, November 9, and their Quilt Show on December 7 in Smithville. She also presented their show quilt entitled "Tropical Breeze," and provided raffle tickets for purchase.

Debbie Novosad, the Guild Secretary, read correspondence received from:

- Yoakum Heritage Museum: Kick it Up Gala on Saturday, October 26 from 6 pm at the Yoakum Community Center

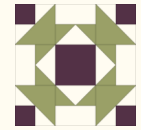
These event proceeds go to help fund the good work of these organizations.

Treasurer Karin Filipp presented the Treasurer's Report for September. The Report was submitted to the Guild Secretary for filing. She also reported on the Financial Review Committee Meeting held on September 24.

Membership Chair Annette Meyer reminded members that this month is the last month to pay guild dues. The Guild is going to be supplied with a new membership roster and any unpaid member will be dropped from the roster, but she also informed that almost all dues have been collected.

Linda called for Committee Reports.

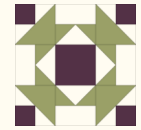

New Business

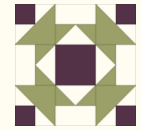

Nursing Home Quilts: Bernadette Kresta and Rhonda Orsak have make quilt packets from donated material from fabric salesman samples. Reminded that quilts are to be NO LARGER than 40 x 40 inches to clear wheelchair wheels. 28 more are needed.

Program: Darcy introduced Jerriann Massey from Annie McHugs of Tyler who presented a program on reverse applique. She and her husband presented a very informative program and showed her many beautiful quilts and shared her quilting journey. Her applique tools were also available for purchase. Members that attended the Monday workshop displayed their projects.

Show & Tell was then enjoyed.

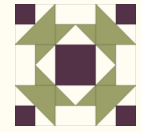
Door Prizes were given.

OCTOBER PRESENTATION • JERRIANN MASSEY • ANNIE MCHUGS

Jerriann Massey of Annie McHugs taught an all-day workshop on Monday, September 30. Thirteen members and one guest participated (and that guest is going to become a member! Welcome, Alice.)



Each student received a patented Picture Windows Reverse Applique Tool with two sizes of circle templates made to fit layer cakes and charm packs. Jerriann, aka Annie, recounted her quilting journey and the revelation that led her to create her Picture Windows template line.

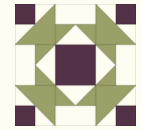


With Annie's encouragement and excellent instructions, each student transformed the eight pieces of fabric they brought to the workshop into four Picture Window reverse applique blocks.

Along the way, Annie shared many beautiful quilts showcasing all her various templates and generously explained many clever shortcuts and piecing tricks. There were lots of AHA moments throughout the day!

technique.

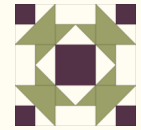

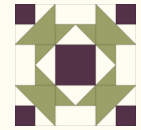

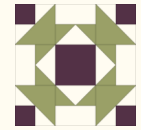

Don't forget to reserve your seat! Sign up and deposit your \$5 reservation fee at the November meeting.

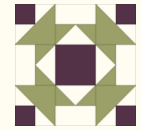

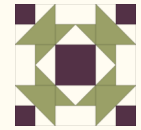

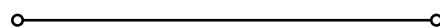

ODDS & ENDS

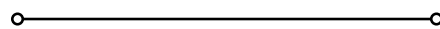
