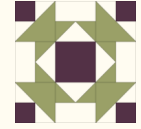

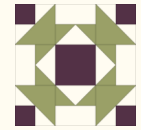

Annie Havel and Yolanda Byrnes, members of the Cuero quilt guild, displayed the beautiful donation quilt and sold chances to our members.

SUNSHINE AND SHADOWS: Rose Mary led with a very accurate poem entitled "Leader of the Guild". Quilt Show Countdown stands at 654 days. June birthdays were celebrated.

SHOW and TELL: 15 members showed their finished projects.

NORMA'S HOUSE: Laura reported we got 9 new quilts at this meeting, bringing the total to 46 quilts for the year. She has some quilts that need binding attached and some to be quilted. Members present said they would help with that.

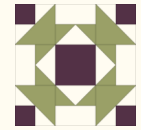
NURSING HOME: Bernadette said we received 11 quilts at this meeting so bringing our yearly total to 40 quilts.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Karin reported: CHECKING: \$16,958.35 SAVINGS: \$11,257.91 TOTAL: \$28,216.26

**MAY MINUTES:** There were no corrections to the May minutes and Rose Mary moved that we approve and Irene seconded the motion. All were in favor.

**ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR 2026-2028:** There was a proposed change in the list of officers: Annette Meyer will be nominated for the 1st VP Membership in place of Charlene Fort as was agreed on by the two members involved. Rae Nell moved that we accept the proposed change and seconded by Dee. Linda asked for a vote of the membership to accept the nomination of officers. All members were in favor. None were opposed. The new term of officers for 2026-2028 was passed!

**CHRISTMAS TREE FOREST COMMITTEE:** Chairman was not present at this time.

**JULY DINNER:** Rae Nell asked that everyone make sure they are signed up to attend and that the \$5 deposit will go to the Shiner Pantry. Our meeting will be held first and we will eat at 6:30 p.m. She said that we need 7 desserts and we have 5 now. Members offered to bring the 2 needed.

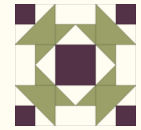
We will learn about these color rules and then sew a freezer-paper pieced gemstone block, using the color interaction principles.

Candace Futch from [My Basket of Faith](#) will present her tips and tricks for sewing with that soft slippery stuff -- SILK! Learn how to conquer this material and get ideas for using hand-dyed silks in quilts and other sewn goods.

Where do I get these hand-dyed silks, you ask? You take the November workshop and make them yourself!

Candace provides prepared fabric (including some practice pieces) and dyes. She will explain the dyeing process and setting techniques. Everyone should finish dyeing all their fabric in the class timeframe, so we can have a group reveal at Show & Tell.
